

#### **Rainbow Van moving to Homer**

The colorful Food Bank Van, affectionately dubbed the "Rainbow Van" is heading for lighter duty at the Homer Food Pantry.



A grant through the Alaska Community Foundation made possible to purchase a vehicle to better accommodate the increased food transport needs of our community. The new truck has 4wheel drive and will be able to haul food to the

new homeless shelter, even when the roads are challenging. It can also be used for hauling wood to keep the wood pile stocked, hauling garden supplies and moving tables, chairs and event items.

#### Nikiski Shelter of Hope

After years of hard work and determination of several community members and organizations, we have a cold weather shelter.

The 22 bed shelter is temporary housing for those in need of refuge from the weather.

It is a safe, warm, dry place offering a clean bed, a place to shower, do laundry and provides resources and support to our homeless neighbors. Several organizations take turns overseeing the facility and being available for residents.

There is a small kitchen for heating things up, but it is not a commercial, DEC approved kitchen for cooking.

So the Food Bank, churches and other organizations have pulled together to prepare and deliver meals to the shelter.
