# LEAVE A LEGACY compassion



Your dedication to feeding our neighbors suffering from hunger has been reflected by your generous donations, volunteer work, and advocacy. Keep that light of compassion burning bright with a Legacy Gift and Planned Giving. Your investment in food programs and advocacy will yield benefits for decades to come. The food bank simply could not exist without donors like you!

#### Give from your Retirement

You can donate assets directly from an IRA to KPFB (qualified charitable distribution or QDC) if you're 70½ or older. A QCD generally does not increase your gross income and can satisfy your required minimum distribution, lowering your tax bill. QCDs can be made electronically or by check payable to KPFB.

#### Give from your Stocks

Giving long-term, appreciated securities has a dual tax benefit. When you give stocks, you receive a higher income tax deduction and the food bank receives more funds. To give from your stocks, contact your broker.

#### **Testamentary Giving**

Giving to KPFB at the time of your passing allows you to maintain control of the assets during your life and can reduce your heirs' estate tax liability. There are many ways to give:

- Talk to your lawyer about adding KPFB to your will.
- Add KPFB as a beneficiary on your retirement accounts, life insurance policies, or annuity contracts.
- Talk to your bank about adding a TOD or POD to your brokerage or bank account.

#### **Endowment Giving**

You can give directly to KPFB's Endowment and ensure your gift adds to the longevity of KPFB! There are several ways to give:

- Send in a check payable to "The Alaska Community Foundation" with "Kenai Peninsula Food Bank Fund" in the memo line or in an accompanying document.
